TERMINATION OF EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 04-1990, ENDING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY IN THE TERRITORY CREATED BY HURRICANE OFA, AND ENTERING INTO THE STATE OF RECOVERY

WHEREAS, on February 4, 1990, an Executive Declaration was issued out of the Governor's Office, declaring and proclaiming that American Samoa was in a state of disaster emergency due to Hurricane Ofa; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, the Honorable George Bush, on February 9th, 1990, declared American Samoa as a major disaster area because of Hurricane Ofa; and

WHEREAS, on the same date, February 9th, 1990, because of the state of disaster emergency, I issued Executive Order No. 04-1990 establishing emergency price control measures and the Board of Emergency Price Control to aid with the Territory's extensive recovery efforts; and

WHEREAS, on Friday, March 23, 1990, I had orally stated that the state of emergency in the Territory created by Hurricane Ofa has ceased, and the Territory now enters and is in the state of recovery.

- 1. NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of American Samoa under provisions of Article IV of the Revised Constitution of American Samoa, and Sections 4.0303 and 26.0105 of the American Samoa Code Annotated, I, Peter Tali Coleman, Governor of American Samoa, do hereby order and declare that Executive Order No. 04-1990 establishing the state of emergency in the Territory be, and the same is hereby terminated and cancelled.
- 2. The Territory now is in the state of recovery and all of the work and programs related thereto shall be executed according to established plans and specifications.

3. Repealer. This Executive Order supersedes Executive Order No. 04-1990 in its entirety. Executive Order No. 04-1990 is cancelled and repealed.
